

Passport	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Do not panic. Losing a passport abroad does not immediately affect your 'legal stay' in a foreign country. 2. Contact the nearest police station. File a report for missing passport. 3. Contact the Indian embassy in The Hague (or a local consulate/embassy if happened abroad) and book an appointment. For non-emergency situations, the embassy provides limited support. 4. Following is valid if your passport is lost in the EU. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. If you are an NRI and wish to stay in the EU (for study, work etc.), opt for a new passport. This process usually takes 5-8 weeks. b. If you are a tourist and have a 90 day visa, you can opt for an emergency certificate. This is a one-time passport to India. IMPORTANT: Once an emergency certificate is issued, the only way to get a passport is by going back to India. 5. Applying for a passport from abroad takes a longer time as most part of the process still happens in India. The embassy has limited control over the process. 6. After the application process is complete, the embassy will provide more details about next steps.
Residence Permit	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. File a police complaint 2. Book an appointment with your gemeente (municipality of the registered city). 3. Understand that you cannot leave the country (of issuing RP) until a new residence permit is issued.
Driving Licence	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. File a police complaint 2. Book an appointment with your gemeente (municipality of the registered city) for a new licence.
Other stuff	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. In case of bank cards & mobile phones, cancel/block your cards and/or mobile phones. 2. File a police complaint. 3. Use track my phone feature from Android & Apple.
